



Submission Document Introduction

On the next pages you will find the submission format where you can outline your idea for a new law or policy that you think would make Canada, and our world, a better place!

Please read over the whole document and consider asking your teacher for help if anything is unclear.

You are encouraged to complete your research into your proposed law or policy affects before you start to write this submission.

In order to be considered, your idea must fall under federal jurisdiction.

Your research should cover the basic idea and why you think this reform is needed, desirable, and practical.

It should also include information about the people or others (e.g. wildlife) who could benefit from or be affected by the reform ? (stakeholders).

There is no minimum or maximum word count. Please be concise without leaving out any important or necessary details. The form is a fillable PDF or it can printed and filled out.

Once you are done with the document, you should go over it once again with your teacher.

Idea Description

1. Briefly state your idea for a federal law or policy reform:

2. Describe the problem that you are trying to solve through your proposed reform.

3. How long has this need or problem existed and why does it occur?

4. Are you aware of any other attempts to solve this problem and why they failed?

Stakeholders or beneficiaries

5. Who might be benefitted by your reform? (Who is going to benefit or be affected by your proposed law or policy?)

6. Would anyone be negatively impacted by your proposed reform and if yes how?

Impact

7. How could your proposed reform change Canada in a positive way?

8. What are some possible ways that this bill could impact Canada in a negative way?

9. Can you suggest any way that your proposed law or policy reform could impact laws or programs that already exist in Canada?

10. What additional actions or expenditures will it take to make your reform a reality? Please note that a private member bill may be ruled out of order if it necessitates new spending. You may therefore wish to consider factors such as:

- Would substantial spending be necessary to deliver on the reform?
- Would the government need to hire additional people to implement the reform?
- Who would be required to cover any additional costs? For example does it impose a fee or tax?
- Does the proposed reform require enforcement? That may or may not require new funding.
